INNOSPEC, INC. REPORTING CORPORATE GOVERNANCE CONCERNS THIRD PARTY NOTICE

An integral part of Innospec's culture is the creation of an environment in which concerns regarding unlawful, fraudulent or unethical matters may be raised without fear of retaliation.

Innospec's employees, customers, suppliers and other stakeholders may report such concerns by emailing Legal.Compliance@Innospecinc.com or by making a report through our whistleblowing hotline, EthicsPoint (see below). Innospec employees may also consult the Reporting Corporate Governance Concerns Policy (available on the company intranet) for details of the other reporting mechanisms that are available to them.

Employees, customers, suppliers and other stakeholders may also have rights, under applicable whistleblowing laws (such as the EU Whistleblowing Directive 2019/1937), to report breaches of law to government-designated authorities, including law enforcement and other government, regulatory and self-regulatory agencies (see the Annex for more (EU) information). If the national laws of countries where Innospec operates differ to this Notice, they will be complied with in the relevant countries and will take precedence over the conflicting parts of this Notice.

The reporting mechanisms described in this Notice are not for general enquiries or complaints that do not involve concerns about unlawful, fraudulent or unethical matters. Such general enquiries and complaints should be directed to your Innospec manager / regular contact or local Innospec office.

Situations that pose an immediate threat to life or risk of personal injury should be reported according to local emergency procedures in the first instance. None of the reporting mechanisms described in this Notice are designed to invoke an emergency response.

Reports are referred to Innospec's Legal Compliance department for investigation by members of Legal Compliance and/or other relevant departments. Where necessary, outside experts may be engaged to assist.

Reports are investigated, actioned and reported in confidence to the greatest extent practicable, with information being shared amongst authorized individuals on a 'need to know' basis. The identity of a person making a report will be kept confidential so far as practicable but may be disclosed to third parties to the extent required by law, or within Innospec as necessary, e.g., to enable a thorough investigation. Innospec may notify concerns to relevant law enforcement and other government, regulatory and self-regulatory agencies.

EthicsPoint

EthicsPoint is a whistleblowing hotline that is operated for Innospec by an independent third party. It is available 24/7/365, for the reporting of concerns in multiple languages by telephone (see numbers overleaf), online (see http://innospec.ethicspoint.com/) or by mobile device:



There is the option (if local laws permit) to report a concern anonymously. (In some parts of the world, laws restrict what information must be accepted and investigated if reported anonymously.) Individuals who make a report to EthicsPoint are provided with a report number and pin code so they can call back or access their report on-line to check for updates and to provide additional information. Reports to EthicsPoint are investigated as described above.
